Abstract:

Journey and movement around the Arabian Peninsula were a trait for the Arabs, depending on the extent of economic prosperity in that region, whether with regard to agriculture or grazing and trade areas. It also happened in the case of the Ma'rib Dam and the exodus of Arab tribes from it towards the rest of the Arabian Peninsula. On the other hand, Arab migrations came out that settled on the eastern and western coasts of the Arabian Gulf for sometimes economic and sometimes political goals.
