Abstract:

This research aims to study and publish a group of Artefacts bearing the Portraits of Imam Ali ibn Abi Talib during the Qajar and Pahlavi eras. The Portraits executed on artistic masterpieces are similar to the descriptions that we have received from historical sources about the appearance of Imam Ali ibn Abi Talib or not.
